Ms. Munzer has appeared as leading guest artist with over ninety opera companies and major symphony orchestras. The Dallas Opera, New York City Opera, Washington Opera, L'Opera de Montreal, Houston Grand Opera, Florentine Opera, The Philadelphia Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, San Francisco Symphony, National Symphony, American Symphony and Hong Kong Philharmonic are a few of the venues. She has sung concert performances in Kuala Lumpur, Singapore, Manila, Jakarta, Penang, Bejing, Shanghai and Hong Kong. Ms. Munzer has performed in the renowned music festivals of Aspen, Wolftrap, Carmel Bach, Oregon Bach, Brattleboro and New York Mozart Bicentennial, and has sung on the Live From Lincoln Center Metropolitan Opera series. Ms. Munzer is assistant professor of voice at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music.

Gary Glaze

Following his debut in Mozart's Don Giovanni at Town Hall, with the Opera Orchestra of New York, tenor Gary Glaze sang leading roles at the New York City Opera, where he appeared regularly for fourteen seasons at the Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. and Los Angeles. Mr. Glaze subsequently won international acclaim for performances with the Netherlands Opera in Amsterdam, the Prague National Opera, and at the Teatro Colon in Buenos Aries. He appeared with the Metropolitan Opera in Mozart's Don Giovanni and Verdi's Falstaff. He has also sung leading roles in Colorado, Wisconsin, Hawaii, Kentucky, Florida, Minnesota, New York and Pennsylvania. In concert, Glaze has sung with symphony orchestras throughout the US. In New York City he has appeared frequently at Avery Fisher Hall, Alice Tully Hall, Metropolitan Museum of Art and Carnegie Hall. Mr. Glaze earned his master's degree at the University of Michigan, where he also pursued doctoral studies in musicology. Mr. Glaze co-founded the Berkshire Opera Company in Massachusetts, and was artistic director for six years. He was appointed Director of Bay View (Michigan) Summer Music Festival in1995. He has been opera director at Temple University, State University of New York at Stony Brook, and the University of Rhode Island. Mr. Glaze is currently professor of voice in the Vocal Arts and Opera Department at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music.
